Journey to the Lower World is a shamanic performance by Marcus Coates. The book features Coates' DVD, photographs by Nick David and writings by Alec Finlay, Mark Wallinger and JJ Charlesworth. Featured in British Art Show 6, the film Journey to the Lower World received national coverage.

Journey is an album of words and images reflecting on human and animal consciousness – how we adapt ancient forms of knowledge, healing and spirituality to fill a void in the contemporary world. Marcus Coates has insistently considered our relationship to nature – where in previous projects he adopted the techniques of scientific observation in Journey he embodies the role of the 'shaman'. The project is a colourful collision of life in a working class Liverpool Tower block and new age spirituality: Journey treads a fine line between pathos and bathos. It is touching because it has enacted the fears and vulnerability of audience, which are real enough if ultimately unknowable, and finds its own strange way to an image of hope for them to take away.
